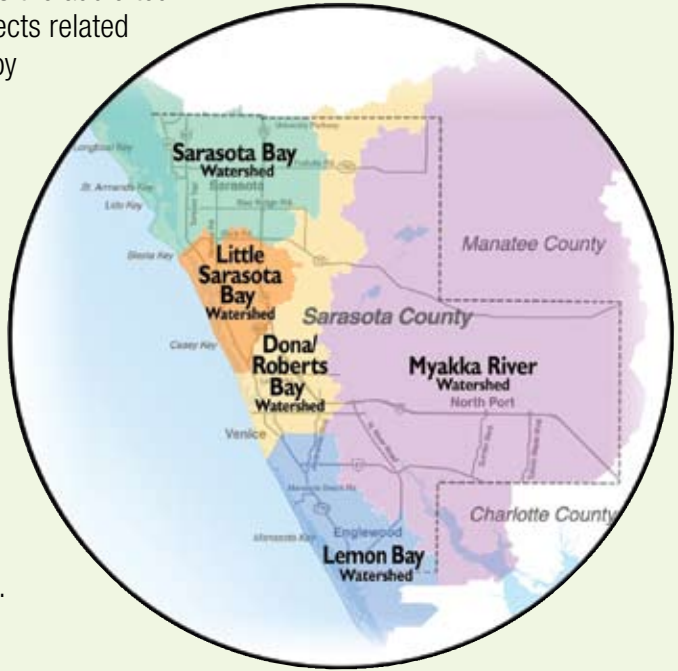


Introducing the Watershed Mobile Phone Audio Tour

You can access the tour from anywhere free of charge. To see the watershed features talked about in the tour, visit the sites listed on the back of this card.

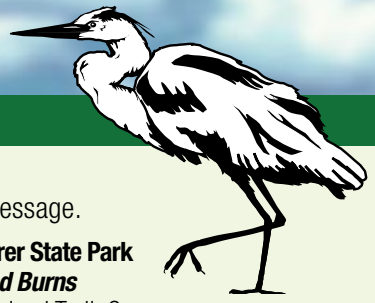
About Our Watersheds
